The Memories of Camp Meeting

I remember my first full camp meeting. We stayed in HP Loop, in a tiny pop-up with one of my mom's friends. It was a long walk to the showers in the auditorium, and it was a long walk to J1, in the Elementary Commons.

In fact, all the way out in HP, it was a long walk almost anywhere. Modern bathrooms? Long walk. Ice cream? Long walk. Friends? Long walk.

It was really hot in that pop-up camper, and it rained. A lot. And on the days that it didn't rain, our shoes were sopping with dew by the time we made it across the big field.

Since then, my mom has been able to acquire my grandfather's camper as a place for us to stay. However, while the camper has been a blessing, it has also caused many hardships.

My grandfather is not Adventist: in fact, he is against anything Adventist, including camp meeting. In order to attend, my mother had to stand up once again and tell her father that she wanted to be a practicing Adventist, despite his disapproval of her Adventist faith.

My grandfather is stubborn, but through God's grace, year after year we have been able to attend camp meeting with his camper. It is nothing short of a miracle. God softens hearts at camp meeting time, both on campus and off.

I've heard story after story of hardships, of the fight to attend camp meeting or church, the fight to be a practicing Adventist, but to see it lived out in my own family has inspired me to stand up for my own

faith too.

When I think of camp meeting, I think of a time to revive our faith, draw closer to Christ, see yet again the Scriptures' power, and to experience the reality of our faith—despite the hardships.

At camp meeting, we all deal with hardships. Leaking tents, pouring rain, wet shoes, boiling sun, the crying baby one camper over, blistered feet: but we endure anyway, and we return year after year.

Why? Because it's worth it. Camp meeting equips us to return home and to better stand up for our faith. Camp meeting equips us to spread the word of God like dandelion seeds. And if we can walk through sheets of rain to listen to a sermon, surely we can hand out a GLOW tract to the cashier at Walmart.

It's camp meeting time again. Maybe you had to fight to get here, like my mother, or maybe you know that your baby isn't going to sleep one night all week—but it's going to be worth it. After all, camp meeting is the time to learn to lean on Jesus, so that when you go home, the mountains looming before you will appear small.

Go to the prayer room, despite the rain. Attend the seminars, even if you're a little sleep deprived. Draw strength from the united song of thousands in the evening meetings: it's camp meeting. Draw close to Jesus. 🙏
